INSTRUCTIONS

Notes: Follow all manufacturer's label instructions for proper product usage. Place a piece of cardboard in the bag, this will prevent bleeding to the back of the bag while painting.

- 1. Mix 2-parts paint to 1-part DecoArt Fabric Painting Medium with each colour being used and mix well with a palette knife.
- 2. Trace and transfer the main outline of the pattern.

- 3. Use the #5 round brush to basecoat the petals with Primary Yellow. Let dry. Use the chisel blender to dry-brush the center of each petal and creases with a brush mix of Marigold and Burnt Umber. Let dry. Use the #10 shader brush to float along the bottom of each petal with Burnt Umber. Highlight the top with Snow White. Let dry. Use the 20/0" script to outline a detailed highlight to the top of the petals with Snow White.
- 4. Use the round brush to basecoat the center of to flower with Burnt Umber. Let dry. Float along the bottom and the bottom center with a brush mix of Burnt Umber and Lamp Black. Let dry. Highlight the top area and top center area with a brush mix of Burnt Umber and Snow White. Use the stylus to dot along the edge with Primary Yellow and Snow White.
- 5. Use the #10 shader brush to basecoat the leaves with Light Avocado. Keeping brush dirty, pick up Aloe and stroke the left side from edge to center and stroke from the right-side from center to edge. Keeping brush dirty, repeat with Snow White. Outline the center vein with Snow White.
- 6. Outline the petals and leaves with Lamp Black.
- 7. Place the Stencil and use the stipple brush best suited to stipple the letters with Primary Yellow. Let dry. Move the stencil a few inches from the top and to the left and stipple with Burnt Umber. This will leave a shadow effect to the letters.

HELPFUL HINTS

Stenciling: Load the bristles with paint and wipe on paper towel to avoid paint blobs on bristles. Use pouncing method for stenciling.

Dry-brushing: Use the #10 chisel blender for dry-brushing. Load the bristles with paint; rub on paper towel to remove as much paint as possible until almost dry. Apply light pressure. (This is also a good way to test the shading before applying to the surface.)

Line work: All line work is done with the script liner brush.
